Master's Programs

Behavior Analysis (Online) Prepare to effectively change behavior, improve lives in a career that is rapidly growing. Program graduates are prepared to work in clinics, educational settings, community centers, non-profit, corporate organizations, and clients' homes.'

Community Health and Prevention Science This program will prepare students to engage in theory, research, and practice in prevention science as related to community health and human services.

Health and Wellness Management This program focuses on preparing professionals to improve and support health and wellness through implementation of evidence-based strategies for behavior change and mobilization of solutions for preventing chronic disease.

Mental Health Counseling Trains counselors for employment in community health agencies, mental health and private practice settings. Graduates become trained counselors who function as wellness-oriented mental health professionals, working within communities to improve individuals and families' lives.

Public Health This multi-discipline degree will prepare you to be a public health educator, applying research and best practices toward health policy and practice.

School Counseling Prepares students to become professional school counselors trained to positively impact the school environment by serving as social justice advocates and providing equitable services to all students, through implementation of a comprehensive school counseling program.

School Psychology This program prepares highly competent school psychologists by preparing students to make significant contributions to educational systems that improve children and families' critical outcomes through up-to-date and research-based practices.

Sport Administration (Online) This program allows graduates to dive deeper into their knowledge of the sport industry by exploring various career occupations ranging from athletic administration, marketing, business development, sport facility operations and more. Our program is affiliated with the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (NIAAA), where you will have the opportunity to complete the NIAAA certification program.

Doctoral Programs

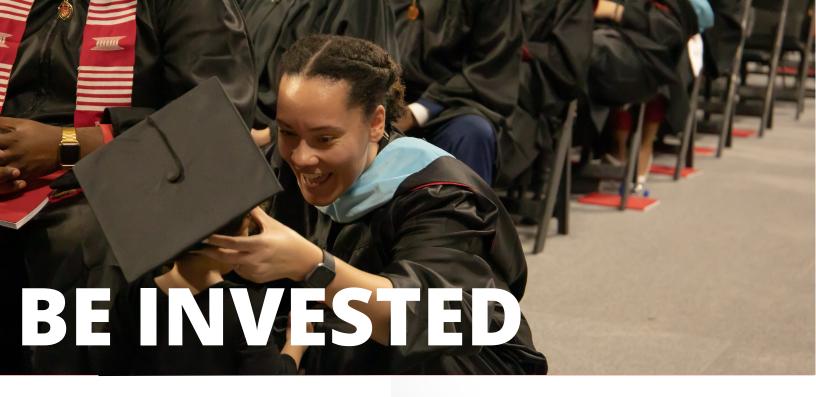
Counselor Education You will become skilled in research, teaching, and service to be a leader in the counseling profession focused on prevention and ecologically-based practice. Related areas of preparation include prevention, substance abuse counseling, and research methods.

Health Education Lead in helping individuals understand health behavior and foster the adoption of research-based practices by studying in a collaborative environment with nationally recognized faculty researchers.

School Psychology Prepare to be a school psychology leader through comprehensive coursework, extensive and integrative field experiences, a year-long internship, and extensive research. Graduate Funding

Funding for graduate and professional students may be awarded by your academic program, the Graduate School, or the Student Financial Aid Office.

Graduate Awards

Some programs are eligible for graduate awards. The following competitive award decisions are made through the individual academic programs.

- >> Graduate Incentive Award (GIA)
- >> Graduate Assistant Scholarship (GAS)

Underrepresented Minority Scholarships

Graduate programs nominate incoming students for the Graduate School's Underrepresented Minority Scholarships. The following scholarships are available to incoming master and doctoral students.

- >> Graduate Dean's Excellence Scholarship: Open to incoming doctoral students and provides a one-time supplementary award of \$3,000 in the student's first fall semester.
- >> Provost Graduate Fellowship: Open to incoming Ph.D. students. This three-year fellowship provides a full-tuition scholarship and an annual stipend of \$25,000.
- >> Yates Fellowship Program: This fellowship is awarded to 25 students each year. Master's students receive a full-tuition scholarship for two years, plus a stipend. Doctoral students receive a full-tuition scholarship for four years, plus a stipend.
