You'll learn the skills necessary to meet the challenges and changing needs of schools and communities in a learning environment that reaches beyond coursework and class discussions.

The Middle Childhood Education Program offers the following concentration areas:

- Natural Science
- Social Studies

Students will also have the opportunity to enhance their studies by adding an additional licensure; Special Education Mild to Moderate License. UC is the only four-year public institution in Ohio offering a dual license option.

There is a growing need for middle childhood education teachers in all licensing areas.

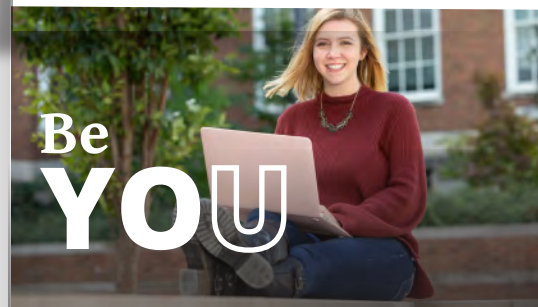
As of 2018, 97% of students completing our Education program pass the Ohio teaching licensure exams

After successfully completing the licensure program and passing state-required licensure exams, you'll be eligible to apply for an initial state of Ohio teaching license. Most graduates elect to teach in Ohio, but our degree may also satisfy teacher licensure requirements in multiple states across the U.S.
