Admissions Requirements

Admission into programs within CECH will depend on the program of interest. Students who were **NOT** admissible directly from high school must have:

- · 24 semester (36 quarter) hours earned
- Minimum cumulative GPA (all prior institutions combined) for:
- » Criminal Justice 2.0
- » Early Childhood Care & Education 2.0
- » Early Childhood Education (PreK-Grade 3) 3.0
- » Early Childhood Education (Birth to 5) 2.5
- » Health Promotion & Education 2.0
- » Human Development & Community Engagement 2.0
- » Information Technology 2.75
- » Middle Childhood Education 2.8
- » Paralegal Studies 2.75
- » Secondary Education 2.8
- » Special Education 2.8
- » Sport Administration 2.25
- » Substance Abuse Counseling 2.0

Credit Evaluation

Even before you apply, you can see how your credits will transfer to Cincinnati!

- Visit uc.edu/aas/creditevaluation/equivalency.html
- When you apply to Cincinnati, your overall transfer credit will be evaluated to determine your admissibility to the university. After you are admitted, CECH will determine how your credits apply towards our degree requirements. Here are some general points to understand about transfer credit:
- » Cincinnati only accepts credits from accredited institutions. Check your school's accreditation at chea.org
- » You must have earned a "D" or better grade for credits to transfer. *
- » Your GPA from other institutions is used to make an admission decision, but does not transfer to Cincinnati.
- » If you have already earned many credits at another institution, you may still have to meet Cincinnati's requirements of 30 or more semester hours to receive a Bachelor's Degree.

*Some programs do not accept a D grade. If you have a D, check with your enrollment services advisor to see if your grade will transfer into the program.

Scholarships

for Transfer Students

University of Cincinnati and CECH offer the following scholarship opportunities to transfer students:

CECH Scholarships

Must be enrolled as a full-time student with a 3.0 GPA

Awards are made based on available funds. Some are renewable over four academic semesters, subject to full-time enrollment at Cincinnati, and satisfactory academic progress. Contact admissions to see if you qualify for these University scholarships.

Applying to Cincinnati means applying for scholarship

When you apply to Cincinnati, your application* will be evaluated for both admission and eligibility for scholarships. To be considered for transfer scholarships, submit your admission application and all other required items to Cincinnati by **July 1**. Proof of an earned associate degree is required. Qualified applicants will be notified accordingly.

*The CECH Transfer Scholarship requires an additional application. Speak with a CECH Enrollment Advisor to learn more.



Checklistfor **CECH** Transfer Students

1. Plan for a successful transfer.

- Check the application deadlines
- We must have <u>all required documents</u> by the application deadline.
- » Fall Semester July 1
- » Spring Semester November 1
- » Summer Semester March 1

2. Apply!

- Application details: cech.uc.edu/future
- \$50 application fee or fee waiver

3. Request your official transcripts.

- Please send official college transcripts from ALL colleges you have previously attended to: University of Cincinnati, Office of Admissions, PO Box 210091, Cincinnati, OH, 45221-0091
- Submit your high school transcripts if you have earned less than 24 semester (36 quarter) hours at another university.

4. Transfer your financial aid.

Add UC Title IV code 003125 to your FAFSA application.

5. Check your application status.

• Go to cech.uc.edu/future to verify that we have received your transcripts, and to get updates on your application status.

6. Confirm your admission at cech.uc.edu/future

- A \$100 non-refundable confirmation fee or fee waiver is required to hold your spot at Cincinnati and must be received by the confirmation deadline.
- » Fall Semester August 1
- » Spring Semester December 1
- » Summer Semester April 1
