FINANCIAL AID

Completing the FAFSA application has never been easier. Here is an overview of the timeline and actions you'll need to complete.

Junior Year in High School - Begin collecting information on scholarships, their deadlines and application processes.

• Visit https://bit.ly/UC_Scholarship-Search to view the list of scholarships offered by UC.

December - Complete annual FAFSA application by this date for priority consideration for limited funding sources.

• Visit *fafsa.ed.gov* for more Financial Aid information.

Mid-February - Initial Financial Aid Award Offers are sent out to students with complete applications.

- Students can visit https://bit.ly/check-my-aid to monitor their aid status.
- Award Offers are sent continually as FAFSA data is received.

June - Fall registration and bill available

July 1 - FAFSA should be submitted by this date to ensure completion of the full process in time for Fall bill payment due date.

• Students may continue to apply after this date though aid may not be processed by the time Fall payment is due.

WRITING PROMPT TIPS:

The University of Cincinnati's Admissions Staff relies on applicants' essays and personal statements to gain insight into their uniqueness, emphasizing the importance of selecting a topic that reflects their personality, skills, and passions for a strong application, offering guidance to create a compelling essay.

 Answer the prompt being asked: When writing your essay and personal statement, be sure you are answering the question the prompt is asking you

• Get help proofing your response: Make sure you re-read your essay and personal statement looking for small mistakes you may have made, and if you can, have a friend, family member or teacher to look as well.

• Tell them something they cannot find in your application: Take advantage of the opportunity to tell the Admissions Staff something new. This will help them get a more accurate picture of who you are as a student and why you would be a great fit at the University of Cincinnati.

• Think about the person reading the essay and personal statement: Your admissions counselor will be reading all the essays and personal statements that come to them from potential applicants. Consider what you would like to share with them and how they may respond to what you write.

NOTE: Essay must be no more than 650 words and your personal statement must be 500 words.

APPLYING TO CINCINNATI MEANS APPLYING FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

Qualified applicants will be notified accordingly.

• Inform your guidance counselor of your interest in applying to UC School of Information Technology, and they will notify the Early IT Team.

2. REQUEST YOUR APPLICATION MATERIALS

- Request your official or unofficial high school transcripts.
- Determine your TEST PLAN CHOICE*
- Letters of recommendation from teachers or counselors are encouraged.

3. APPLY

- Submit UC Common Application: https://admissions.uc.edu/apply.html
- \$50 application fee or fee waiver
- We must have <u>all required documents</u> by the application deadline.

Early Action Deadline - December 1** Fall Semester - March 1 Spring Semester - November 1 Summer Semester - March 1

**Apply by this date to be considered for scholarships and the honors program.

4. CHECK YOUR APPLICATION STATUS

6. CONFIRM YOUR ADMISSION
