Cultivating leadership in front-line Juvenile Justice staff for systemic change.

Building upon the findings from **Systems in Crisis: Rethinking the Juvenile Justice Workforce and Foundation Strategies for Improving Public Safety and Youth** 

**Outcomes**, the Council of State Governments Justice Center, in partnership with the University of Cincinnati Corrections Institute and the Center for Juvenile Justice Reform at Georgetown University's McCourt School of Public Policy, and supported by the United State Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, are eager to share a new training and technical assistance opportunity for juvenile justice professionals.

Designed to help jurisdictions cultivate organizational champions, teams will become expert ambassadors, coaches, strategists, and innovators prepared to lead both internal and external staff recruitment, retention, and wellness efforts. Champions will learn about evidence-based practices, communication, and leadership, and how to leverage skills to re-shape culture, climate, and agency practices to effectively respond to the growing concerns around youth crime and violence.

This opportunity is open to anyone who works closely with youth involved in the justice system at the state and local levels (e.g., community supervision officers, case managers, corrections officers, counselors, clinicians, residential staff).

Applicants must demonstrate a passion for their work, and a strong desire to transform not only their agency, but the system at large. Up to 10 teams comprised of at least three people per agency (front-line staff with a supervisor) will be selected from state, county, and/or tribal jurisdictions.
